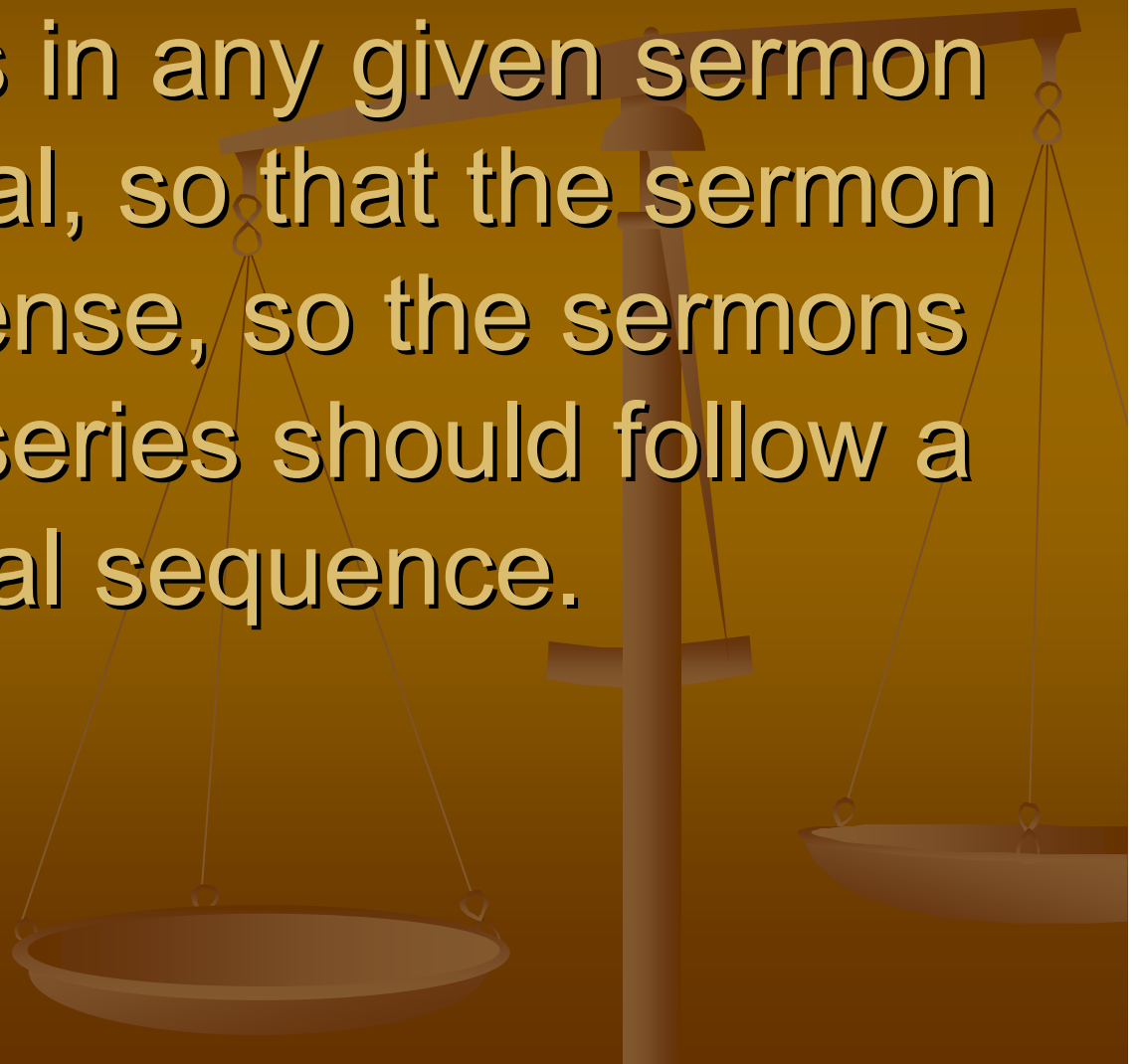

There are several types of sermons in a series, and all must be Bible based and Christ centered.

There are some five classification of evangelistic sermons:

■ Salvation Sermons

- These are sermons which explore God's great plan to save lost sinners through Jesus Christ. Here a man sees himself as a sinner and is pointed to the sin bearer, Jesus Christ.

• Doctrinal Sermons

- These sermons present to the hearers the various teachings that God expects His saved children to adhere to and live by. These are referred to as testing truths. In presenting these sermons the evangelist needs to prove beyond the shadow of a doubt that the Bible supports his position.

► Social Sermons

- These sermons deal with social issues, love, courtship, marriage, divorce and yada. These are mostly thrown in after a hard doctrinal subject to relax the audience and to ensure a steady crowd.


- Decision Sermons

- These are sermons that make a decision for Christ easy. They should give the individual the opportunity to become SDA Christians and demonstrate it by baptism.

• Mixture (hybrid) Sermons

- This category is as it suggests. It is a combination of some of the previous elements and the inclusion of sermons on courage and excuses.
- I find it necessary to use a mixture after my first baptism. For two main reasons:
 - Re-indoctrination of the new believers
 - To enable the late and new comers to make intelligent decisions

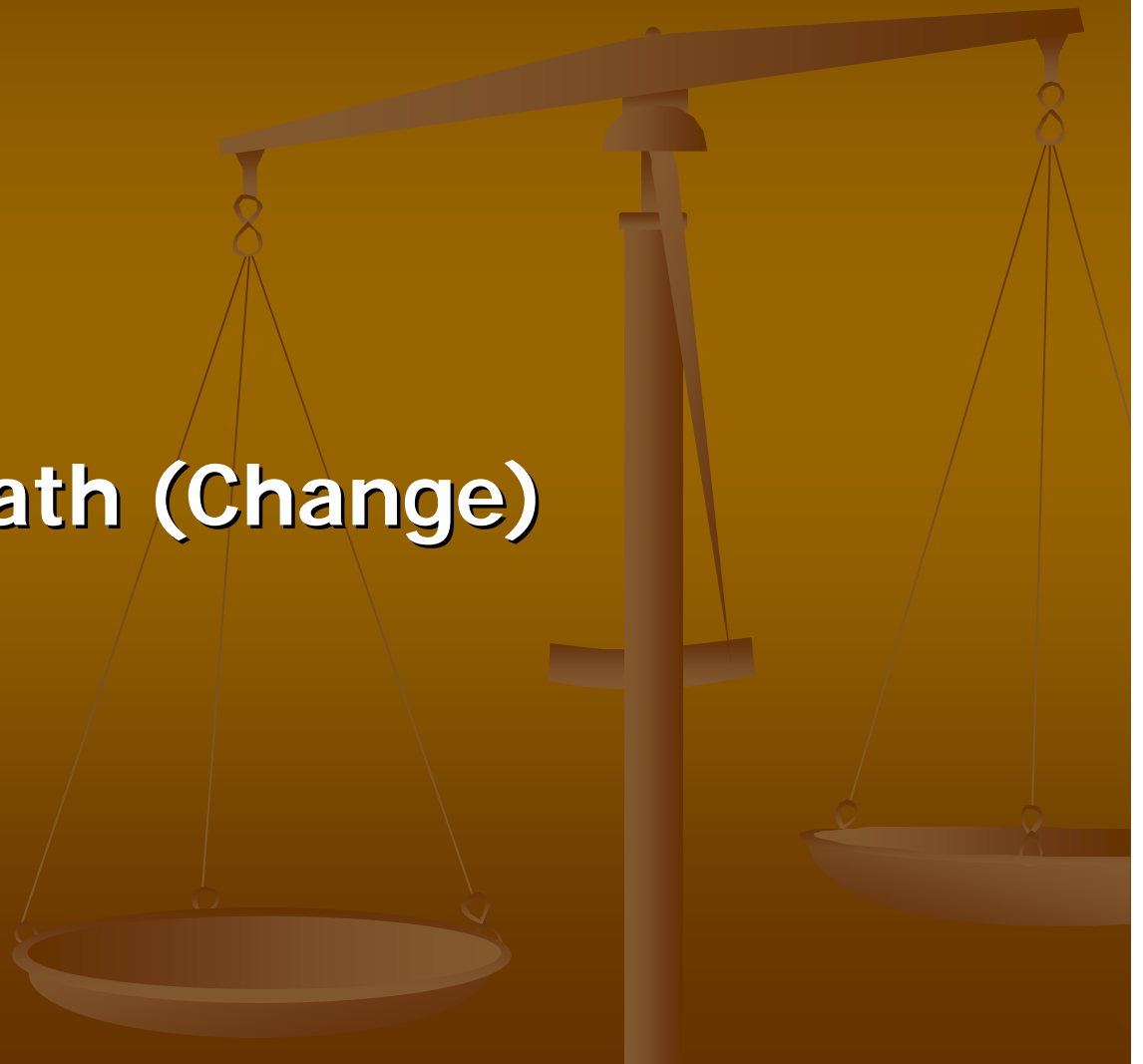


